
INOAC Supports the Kentucky Community & Technical College System (KCTCS)


INOAC Workforce – February 15, 2016



History of the INOAC and KCTCS Partnership




Through annual Team Member Engagement Surveys conducted each February since 2012, we have seen dramatic improvements in Personal Growth, Employment Stability and Continuous Improvement – three key drivers that we link directly to our training and talent development efforts.



October 2012: Business Training Provided at the ECTC Springfield Campus

- Eight (8) specific training courses on software, communications and performance management
- 77 INOAC team members participated
- 1,413 training hours completed

January 2015: Introduction of KYFAME

INOAC was honored in January 2015 to join the statewide board of KY FAME (<u>link</u>), an impressive partnership lead by manufacturers and supported by education and economic development leaders to launch an innovative, apprentice-style education and training program throughout Kentucky.

Program participants attend classes two days per week at a local KCTCS campus and work an additional 24 hours per week for a sponsoring employer. Upon completion of the program, students receive an associate degree in Applied Sciences, and, with the practical skills gained during their paid work experience, most begin full-time employment with the sponsor. The Lincoln Trail Chapter which includes Marion, Nelson and Washington counties initially participated by utilizing the Elizabethtown campus and have expanded the program to use the Springfield campus beginning this summer.

October 2015: INOAC Launches People Upward Mobility Program (PUMP) in Springfield

To support continued growth across the automotive industry, we worked closely with KCTCS to develop an 18-month certificate program for specialty skilled roles within INOAC. At the current time, we have 25 students enrolled with an additional class scheduled to start in May 2016.

As a successful business owner, I am confident that you understand the challenge that we face in finding talent that is willing to make a long-term commitment to a Company. Frankly speaking, finding qualified individuals who are willing to accept challenging work in a drug-free environment is a significant challenge so we have taken it upon ourselves to "grow our own" with a goal to tackle both the recruiting and retention needs of a growing business.
